- 12.902 (c) Family Law Financial Affidavit (Income \$50,000 or more
annually)

- 12.902 (i) Affidavit of Corroborating Witness (or Driver's License to
prove Florida Residency for 6 months)

- 12.902 (j) Notice of Social Security Number (FROM BOTH
PARTIES)

- 12.903 (a) Answer, Waiver, and Request for Copy of Final Judgment
of Dissolution of Marriage (FROM RESPONDENT)

- 12.990 (b) (3) Final Judgment of Dissolution of Marriage w/No Property
or Minor Children

The above-referenced forms can be obtained on the Internet at www.flcourts.org - Self Help - Family Law Forms or purchased from the Family Law Clerk's office.

1. Prepare paperwork.
2. File with Clerk.
3. If no agreement or an answer has not been filed, ask Clerk to
prepare summons and attach copies of paperwork.
4. Sheriff to serve.
5. The respondent has 20 days from the date of service to answer
your petition.
6. When the respondent answers you may request the Family Law
Clerk to send the file to the Judge's office for referral to the
General Magistrate.

- 7. If the respondent does not answer your petition after 20 days from the date of service you may file a Motion for Default with the Family Law clerk (form 12.922 (a) and (b)).**

It is your responsibility as a self-represented litigant to move the case through the system by following these steps.
